In accordance with the IATA Air Mail Board 34th (AMB/34) at Singapore on March 10th, 2019. Cargo Terminal Operations Department on behalf Thai Airways International Public Company Limited reserves the right to refuse the AWB/CN switching process from the origin through transit point to destination as this document mismatched leads the critically affects the Post logistic operation, information provided to governmental body, and calculation of handling and storage fees, and other related issues (if any). Paperwork consistency (i.e. either AWB or CN all the way to destination) is highly recommended by IATA.

Therefore, in case you wish to make any changes at transit point under Cargo Terminal Operation's custody, please ensure full procedural compliance with Customs as well as sole responsibility for any risks associated with this process.
